Date of issue of the Official Journal (Patents) in which the notice is published.

code meaning

A patentee may offer to surrender his patent at any time without payment of a fee. Such an offer is advertised in the Official Gazette and any person may give notice of opposition to the offer within a specified time. The notice should be accompanied by a statement setting out the opponent's interest, the facts relied upon and the relief sought. The patentee must file a counterstatement setting out his response. Failure to file a counterstatement leads to the patentee's case being treated as undefended. The opposition is heard by the comptroller and there is an appeal from any decision. When the comptroller is satisfied that there is no objection to the surrender he makes out an order revoking the patent.
